Digging Deeper

- The text above involves a task given to a set of servants involving a LOT of money. What would you do if someone gave you that much money and asked you to take care of it for them?
- How we view God impacts our response to what's been entrusted to us. This is what the entire parable above is about. Do you have a scarcity view/mindset of God or an abundance view/mindset of God?
- "Attempt great things for God, expect great things from God." How does this quote resonate with you? What does it mean for you?
- There are two applications to the message: personal and congregational. What has God entrusted to you and how are you using it (personal)? As a church, are we going to hoard what we have, hide it, sit on it and play it safe?
 - How did these two applications and questions impact you? Did you sense God speaking to you at all?
