Joshua: A Tale of Two Cities Part 2

Joshua 6:17-7:13



There is a second part to the Jericho story in the book of Joshua—it's the city of Ai. In this second part of the narrative one of the Israelites (Achan) disobeys God's commands regarding the "devoted things". If Jericho and Rahab are a reminder of how quickly an outsider can become an insider through obedience, Ai and Achan are a reminder of how quickly an insider can become an outsider through disobedience.
